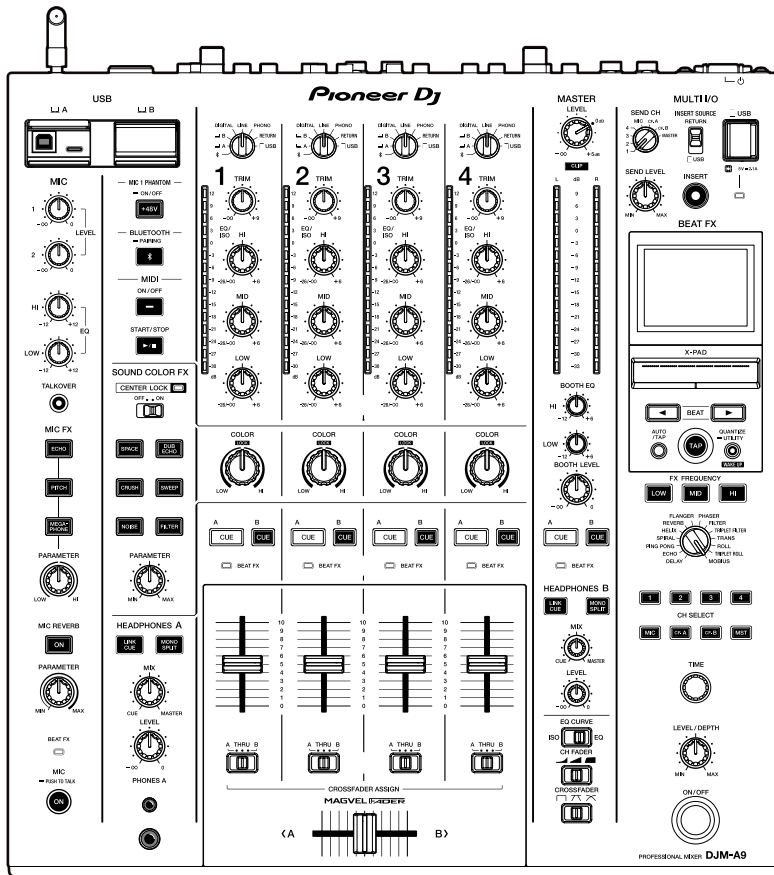

- In this manual the names of buttons, knobs and terminals that appear on the product, and the names of buttons, menus etc. in the software on your PC/Mac or mobile device, are indicated within square brackets ([]). (e.g. **[File]**, **[CUE]** button)
- Please note that the software screens and their specifications, as well as the external appearance and specifications of the hardware, are subject to change without notice.
- Please note that depending on the operating system version, web browser settings, etc. operation may differ from the ways described in this manual.
- Please note that the language on the screens of the software described in this manual may differ from the language on your screen.

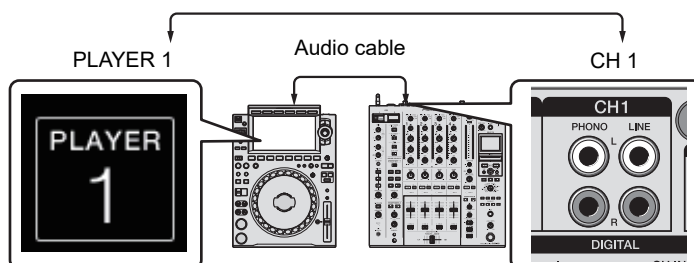

PRO DJ LINK

You can use PRO DJ LINK functions by connecting the unit via a LAN cable to a PRO DJ LINK compatible multi player and a PC/Mac running rekordbox.

- You can connect up to 4 multi players and up to 2 computers (PC/Mac) to the unit via a switching hub.
- Use a 100BASE-TX compatible switching hub that is supported by multi players. Some switching hubs may not work properly with selected devices.
- Set the multi player number to the channel number which the audio cable is connected to.

❖ Quantize

When you are playing a track analyzed by rekordbox, the unit applies BEAT FX by automatically synchronizing it with the beat according to the track's GRID information. This happens even if you operate the **[ON/OFF]** button in the Beat FX section and X-PAD roughly.

❖ Link Monitor

You can browse and monitor via headphones the sound of tracks in rekordbox on a PC/Mac, or on a multi player, while playing a different track (page 31).

- To monitor the sound of rekordbox, click **[File] > [Preferences] > [Audio]** and mark the **[Use "LINK MONITOR" of PIONEER DJ Mixers]** check box in rekordbox.
- You can't monitor the sound of a track from a multi player if the player doesn't support the LINK MONITOR function.

❖ Status Information

You can check on-air information with multi players.

❖ Stagehand

You can use the Stagehand app on a tablet to check the status of Pioneer DJ multi players or mixers and remote-control them.

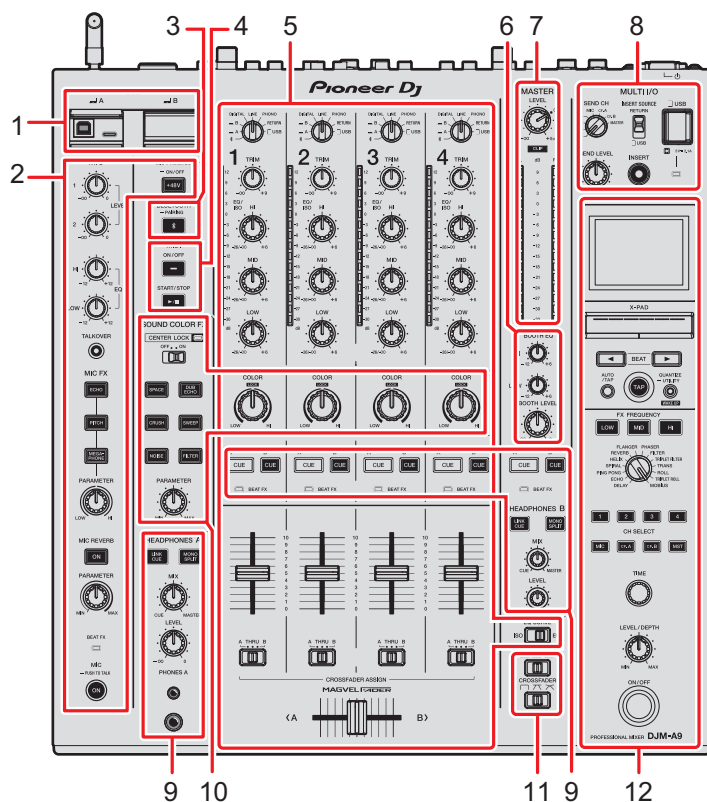
- You can use the Stagehand app while using PRO DJ LINK.

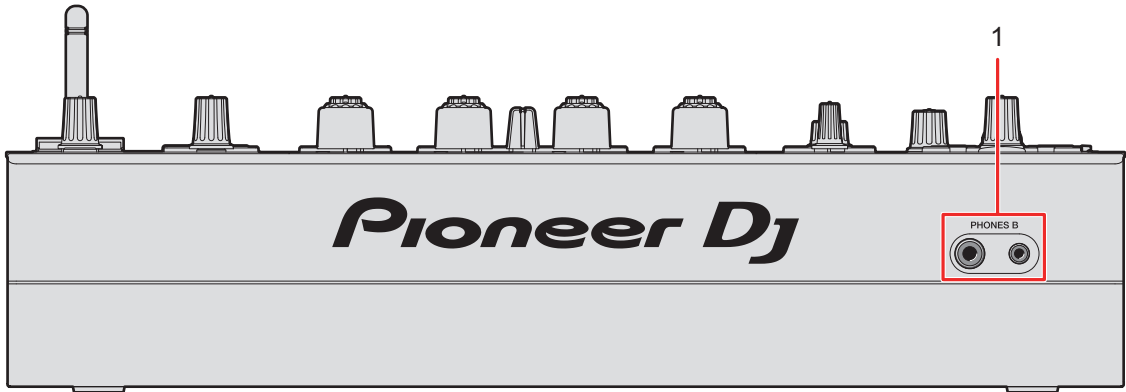

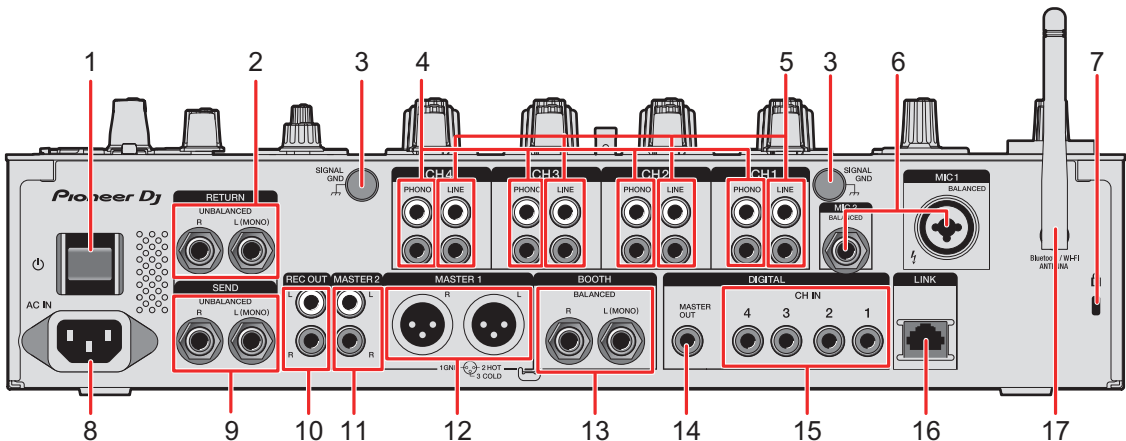

Front panel



1. **PHONES B terminals** (pages 22, 32)

Rear panel



1. **⏻ button**
Turns the unit on and off.
2. **RETURN terminals (1/4"/6.35 mm, TS)** (page 23)
Connect to output terminals on external effects units.
 - If you connect a device to the [L (MONO)] terminal only, the sound input to the [L (MONO)] terminal is also input to the [R] channel.
3. **SIGNAL GND terminal** (page 20)
Connect a turntable's ground wire.
Reduces noises that occur when a turntable is connected to the unit.

4. **PHONO terminals (RCA)** (page 20)

Connect phono-level (MM cartridge) output devices.

- Do not input line-level signals to the terminals.
- Remove the short-circuit pin plugs from the terminals when connecting devices. When you aren't using the terminals, attach the short-circuit pin plugs to cut out external noises.

WARNING

Keep the short-circuit pin plugs out of the reach of children and infants. If accidentally swallowed, contact a doctor immediately.

5. **LINE terminals (RCA)** (page 20)

Connect multi players or line-level output devices.

6. **MIC 1 terminal (XLR or 1/4"/6.35 mm, TRS), MIC 2 terminal (1/4"/6.35 mm, TRS)** (page 20)

7. **Kensington security slot**

Connect a cable lock.

8. **AC IN** (page 20)

Connect to a power outlet with the supplied power cord.

9. **SEND terminals (1/4"/6.35 mm, TS)** (page 23)

Connect to input terminals on external effects units.

- If you connect equipment to the [**L (MONO)**] terminal only, mono sound is output.

10. **REC OUT terminals (RCA)** (page 21)

Connect a device for recording.

11. **MASTER 2 terminals (RCA)** (page 21)

Connect to analog input terminals on a power amplifier, etc.

12. **MASTER 1 terminals (balanced XLR)** (page 21)

Connect to analog input terminals on a power amplifier, etc.

- Use the terminals for balanced output only.
- Do not connect a power cord from another product to the terminals.

13. **BOOTH terminals (1/4"/6.35 mm, TRS)** (page 21)

Connect a booth monitor.

- Use the terminals for balanced output only.
- If you connect equipment to the [**L (MONO)**] terminal only, mono sound is output.

14. **DIGITAL MASTER OUT terminal (RCA)** (page 21)

Connect to a digital terminal on a preamplifier, etc.

Outputs the master sound in SPDIF format.

- Do not connect to an analog input terminal.

15. **DIGITAL CH IN terminals (RCA)** (page 20)

Connect to a digital coaxial output terminal on a multi player, etc.

- Sound may break when the output signal's sampling frequency changes.

16. **LINK terminal** (page 20)

Connect to a LINK terminal on a PC/Mac running rekordbox or a PRO DJ LINK compatible multi player.

- Use a switching hub (100BASE-TX compatible type) to connect multiple devices.

17. **Wireless antenna** (page 62)

Connect and raise the antenna when you connect via Wi-Fi or Bluetooth.

PC/Mac setup

To input or output your PC/Mac's audio to/from the unit, install the dedicated audio driver software and/or Setting Utility on your computer.

If you install the dedicated software to your PC (Windows), the Setting Utility and audio driver software will be installed.

If you use a Mac, only the Setting Utility will be installed.

- Operation isn't guaranteed on all PC/Mac models, even if the system requirements are met.
- Operation isn't guaranteed when multiple units are connected to a PC/Mac.
- If a PC (Windows) without the dedicated audio driver software installed is connected to the unit, errors may occur on the PC.
- Malfunctions may occur due to incompatibility with other software installed on a PC/Mac.

Installation

❖ Notes on installation

- Turn the unit off and disconnect the USB cable connected to the unit and the PC/Mac before installation.
- Close all applications running on the PC/Mac before installation.
- You'll need admin rights to install the dedicated software to your PC/Mac.
- Read the Software License Agreement terms carefully before installation.
- If you quit the installation halfway through, perform the installation procedure from the beginning again.
- After the installation is complete, connect the PC/Mac to the unit.
- Operation isn't guaranteed on all PC/Mac models.

Downloading the dedicated software

1 Visit the URL below.

3 Click [DJM-A9] under [DJ MIXER].

4 Click [Drivers].

5 Click [Download link] and save the file.

- Download the software dedicated to your PC/Mac.

Installing the dedicated software

1 Unzip the downloaded dedicated software.

2 Double-click the installation file.

- Double-click “DJM-A9_#.###.exe” if you’re using a PC (Windows), or “DJM-A9_M_#.###.dmg” → “DJM-A9SettingUtility.pkg” if you’re using a Mac (# indicates the version number of the software).

3 Read the Software License Agreement terms carefully.

If you agree to the terms, mark the [Agree] check box and click [OK].

- If you don’t agree to the Software License Agreement terms, click [**Disagree**] (for Mac)/[**Cancel**] (for Windows) to cancel the installation.

4 Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the installation.

Setting Utility

Once you've installed the dedicated software on your PC/Mac, you can use the Setting Utility to check and set connections between the unit and a PC/Mac.

Launching Setting Utility

❖ For Mac

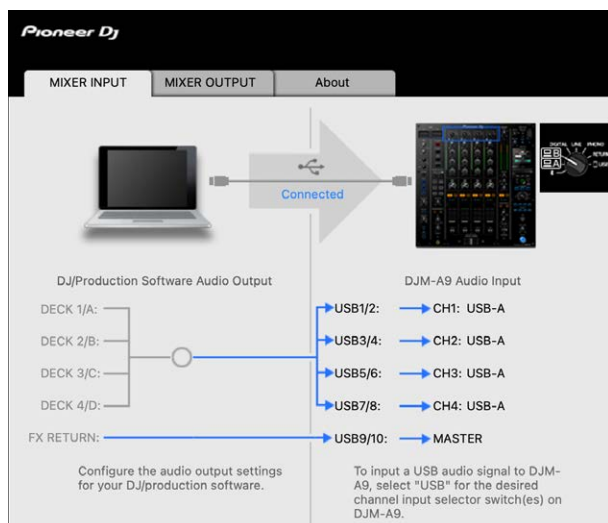
- 1 Open the [Applications] folder in Finder.
- 2 Click [Pioneer] → [DJM-A9] → [DJM-A9 Setting Utility].

❖ For PC (Windows)

- 1 Open the Start menu and click [Pioneer] → [DJM-A9 Setting Utility].

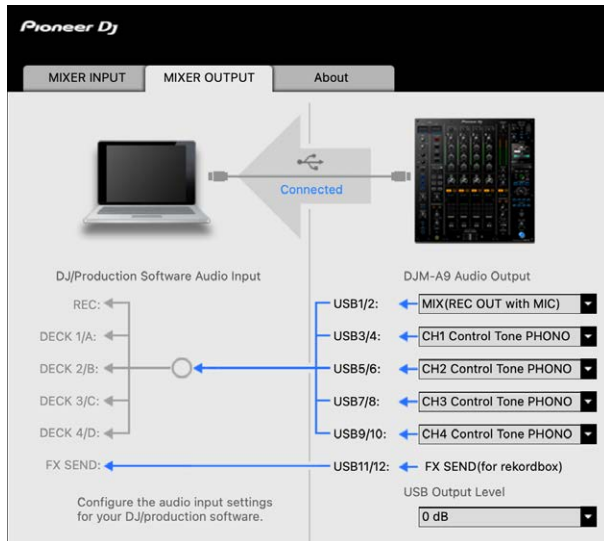
Checking the status of the input selector switches on the unit

- 1 Click the [MIXER INPUT] tab.



Setting the audio data output from the unit to a PC/Mac

- 1 Click the [MIXER OUTPUT] tab.
- 2 Click the pull-down list under [DJM-A9 Audio Output] and select the audio data output from the unit to the PC/Mac.

- 3 Click the pull-down list under [USB Output Level] and select a level of volume to output from the unit.

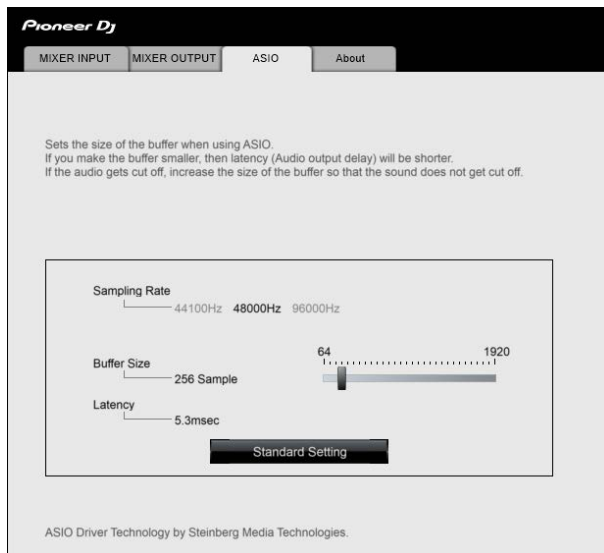
- Set the volume in [USB Output Level] when you can't produce as much volume as you expect using the volume adjustment in your DJ application. Note that the sound may be distorted if you set the volume too high.

Adjusting the buffer size (for Windows ASIO)

- Close any running applications (DJ applications, etc.) which use the unit as the default audio device before adjusting the buffer size.

1 Click the [ASIO] tab.

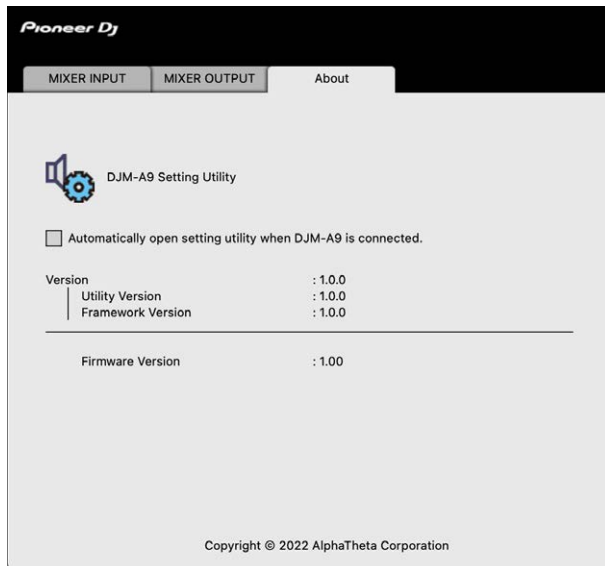
2 Adjust the buffer size with the slider.



- Breaks in sound are less likely to occur if you set a large buffer size, but this increases lag time due to the latency of audio data transmission.

Checking the firmware and dedicated software versions

1 Click the [About] tab.

^[1] For uses other than recording, be sure to set the DJ application so that no sound loop occurs. Sound may be input or output at an unintended volume level when a sound loop occurs.

^[2] Available for software applications that support the function. Outputs sound at the volume input to the unit regardless of the [USB Output Level] setting.

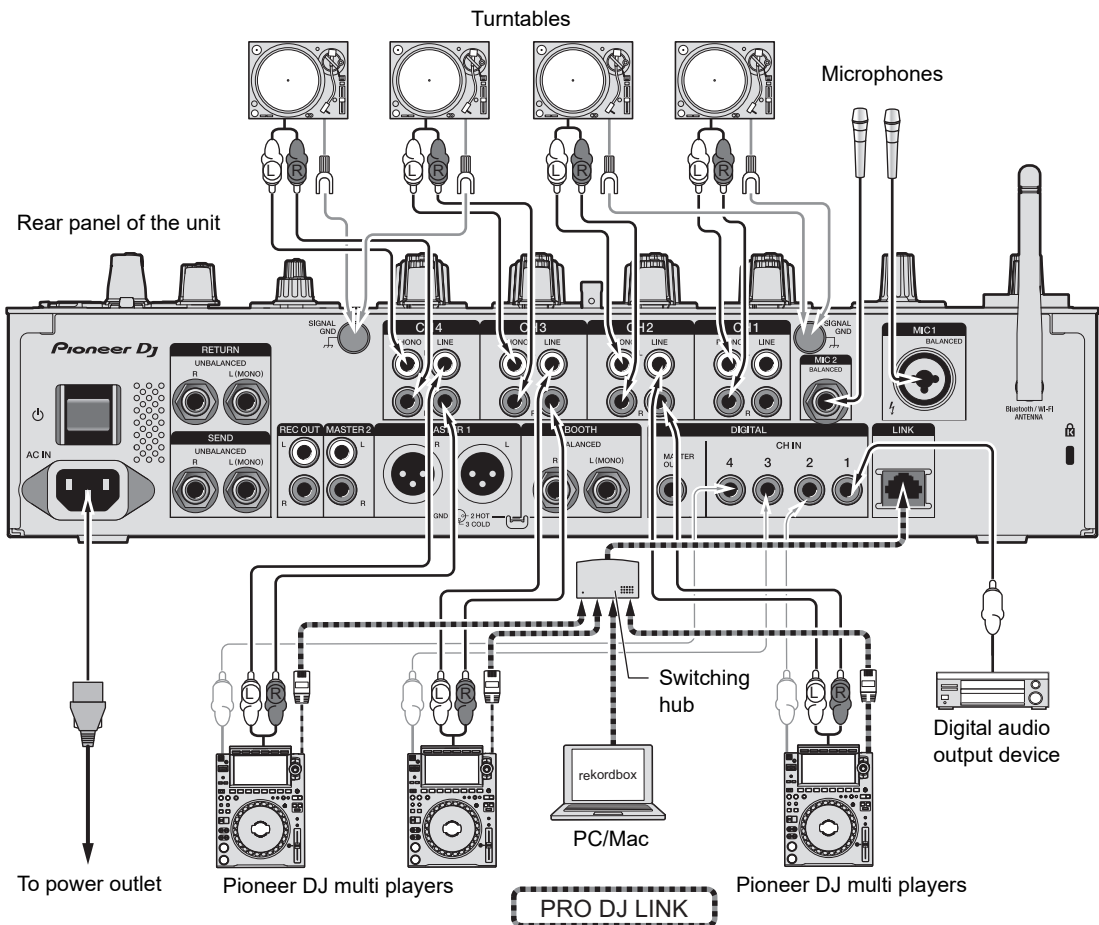
Connections (basic styles)

Turn the unit off and disconnect the power cord before connecting other units.

Connect the power cord after all the connections are complete.

- Use the supplied power cord.
- Read the instruction manuals for the devices you are going to connect with the unit.
- For wired LAN connections, use a Cat5e (or higher) STP cable.
- Do not disconnect a LAN cable when using PRO DJ LINK.

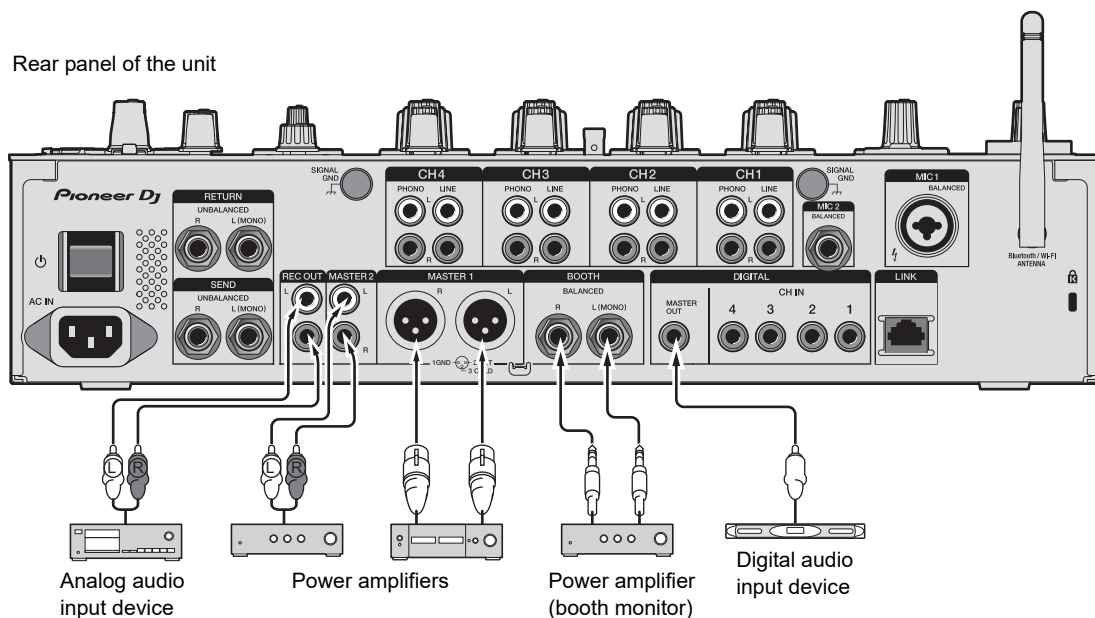

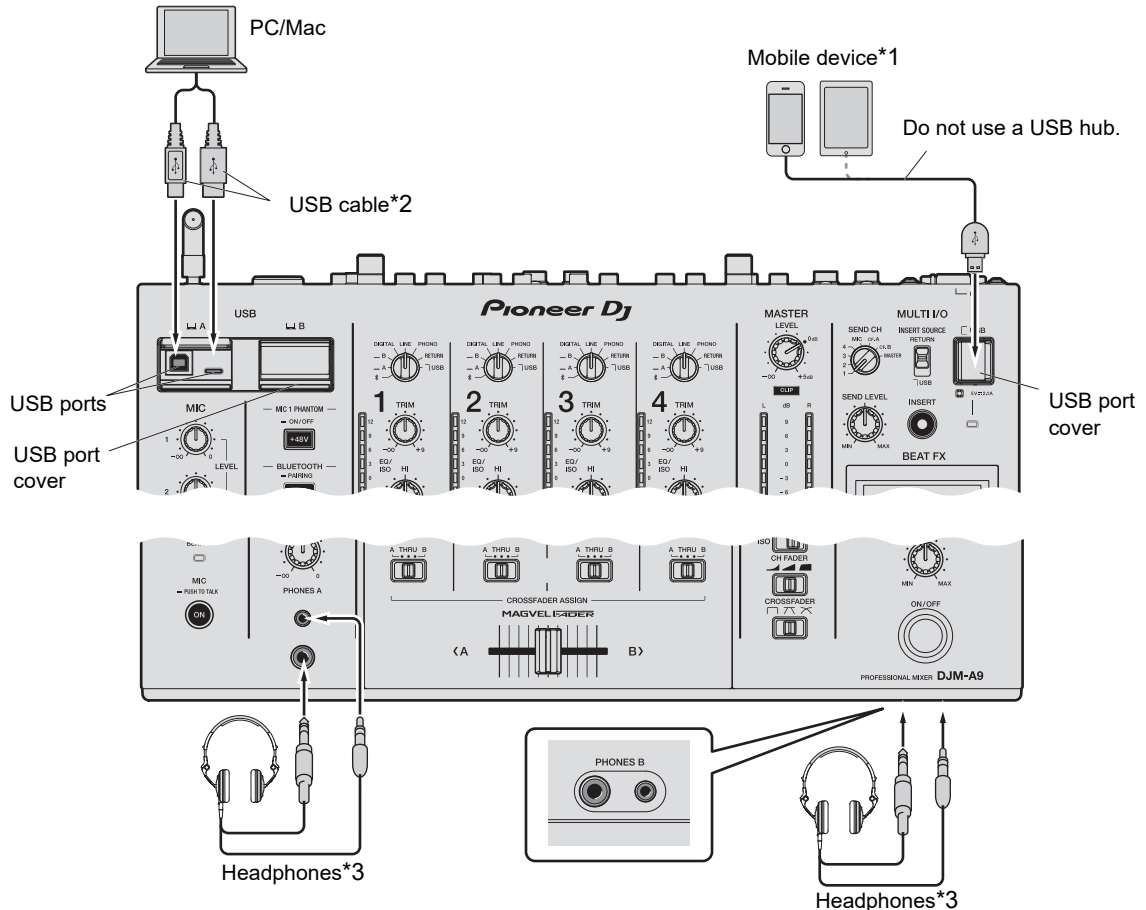
Connecting to the output terminals

Rear panel of the unit



- Use the [**MASTER 1**] terminals for balanced output only. Connecting the terminals to unbalanced inputs (RCA, etc.) with an XLR-RCA conversion cable (conversion adapter), etc. results in unwanted noises and/or poor sound quality.
- Use the [**MASTER 2**] terminals for unbalanced input (RCA, etc.).
- Use the [**BOOTH**] terminals for balanced output only. Connecting the terminals to unbalanced inputs results in unwanted noises and/or poor sound quality.
- Do not connect a power cord from another product to the [**MASTER 1**] terminals.

Connecting to the terminals on the top and front panels



*1 Use a cable supplied with the mobile device to connect it to the unit.

*2 We recommend using a USB cable to connect this unit directly with a PC/Mac.
If you want to use a USB hub, use a product recommended by the manufacturer of your PC/Mac.
We don't guarantee compatibility of all USB hubs.

*3 Connect headphones to one of the terminals (jack or mini-jack). If you use both terminals at the same time, the volume for headphones may decrease and/or the sound quality may deteriorate.

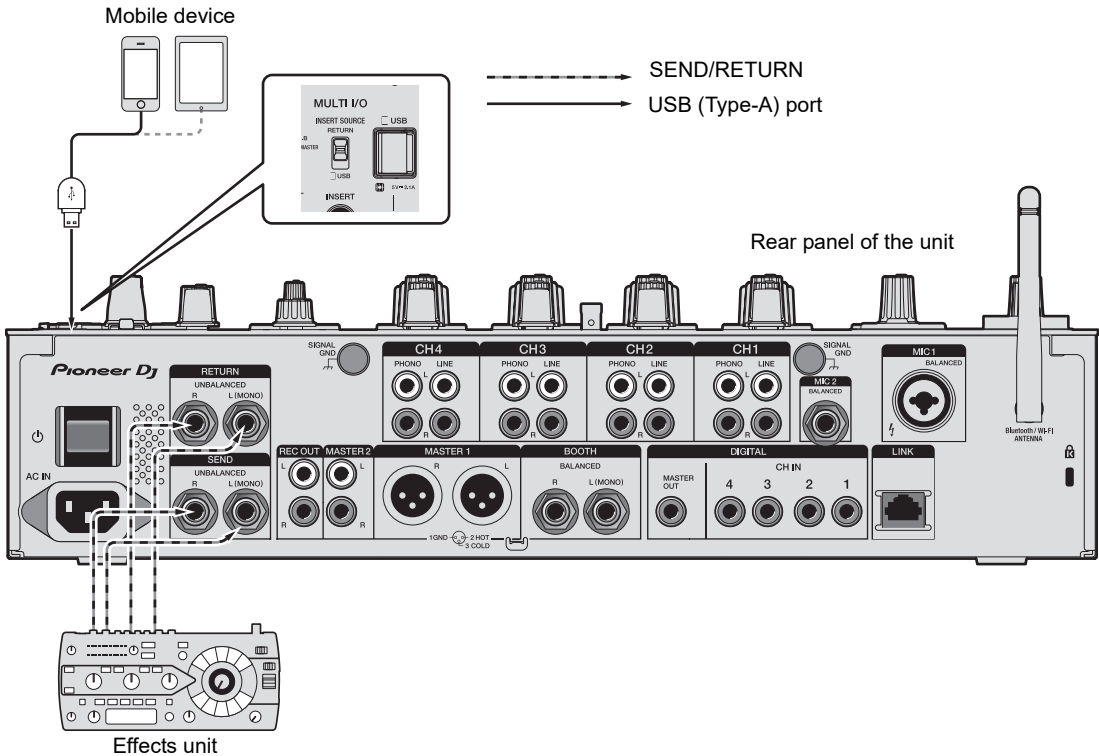
- Do not connect mobile devices to the USB Type-B or Type-C ports.
- To input or output your PC/Mac's audio to/from the unit, install the dedicated software on your computer (page 13).
- Do not press or pull the USB port covers with excessive force, or they may be damaged.

Connecting external effects units

Connecting to the MULTI I/O terminals

You can use external effects units or mobile devices by connecting them to the MULTI I/O terminals as follows.

- [SEND] terminals (output) → effects unit → [RETURN] terminals (input)
- Mobile device connection terminal (USB port) (input/output port) → mobile device
- Be sure to connect external effects units to the [RETURN] terminals (input) as well.

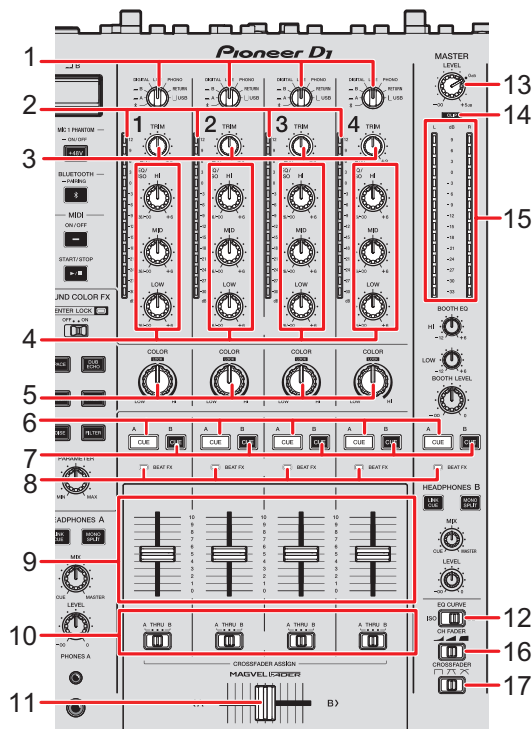

Channel section/master section/fader curve section



❖ Channel section

1. Input selector switch

Selects an input sound source.

- []: Selects a PC/Mac or mobile devices connected via Bluetooth.
- [ **A, B**]: Selects a PC/Mac connected to the [**USB**] port.
- [**DIGITAL**]: Selects a multi player connected to the [**DIGITAL CH IN**] terminals.
- [**LINE**]: Selects a multi player, etc. connected to the [**LINE**] terminals.
- [**PHONO**]: Selects a turntable connected to the [**PHONO**] terminals.
- [**RETURN**]: Selects the effect sound of a device connected to the [**RETURN**] terminals.
- [ **USB**]: Selects the effect sound of a device connected to the mobile device connection terminals.

2. **Channel level indicator**

Displays the volume level before the sound passes through the channel fader.

3. **TRIM knob**

Adjusts the volume for the channel input sound.

4. **EQ/ISO (HI, MID, LOW) knobs**

Adjusts the volume of each frequency band.

Each knob adjusts in the following range.

- [**HI**]: -26 dB to +6 dB
- [**MID**]: -26 dB to +6 dB
- [**LOW**]: -26 dB to +6 dB

5. **COLOR knob** (page 38)

6. **CUE A button** (page 32)

7. **CUE B button** (page 32)

8. **Beat FX indicator**

Lights up on the channel selected with the [**CH SELECT**] button.

9. **Channel fader**

Adjusts the volume for the channel output sound according to the channel fader curve set with the [**CH FADER**] switch. Moving it up increases the volume, and down decreases the volume.

10. **CROSSFADER ASSIGN (A, THRU, B) selector switch**

Assigns the channel output sound to the crossfader.

- [**A**]: Assigns to the [**A**] (left) side.

- **[THRU]**: Bypasses the crossfader.
- **[B]**: Assigns to the **[B]** (right) side.

11. Crossfader

Adjusts the volume balance between the channel output sounds according to the crossfader curve specified with the **[CROSSFADER]** switch. Moving it to the **[A]** side outputs the sound assigned to **[A]**, and to the **[B]** side outputs the sound assigned to **[B]**.

12. EQ CURVE switch

Selects the function (isolator or equalizer) to adjust with the **[EQ/ISO (HI, MID, LOW)]** knobs.

❖ Master section

13. LEVEL knob

Adjusts the volume for the master sound.

14. CLIP indicator

Lights up when excessive volume is output from the **[MASTER 1]** or **[MASTER 2]** terminals.




15. Master level indicator

Displays the volume level of the master sound output to the **[MASTER 1]**, **[MASTER 2]** or **[DIGITAL MASTER OUT]** terminals.

❖ Fader curve section


16. CH FADER switch





Sets the channel fader curve.

- : Steeply raises the volume when the channel fader is moved close to the top position.
- : Gradually raises the volume as the channel fader is moved up.
- : Steeply raises the volume as the channel fader is moved from the bottom position.

17. CROSSFADER switch

Sets the crossfader curve.

- : Steeply raises the volume of the sound assigned to the other side as the crossfader is moved from one side (**[A]** or **[B]**) to the other (e.g. moving the crossfader away from the **[A]** side steeply increases the volume of the **[B]** side).

- : Applies the intermediate setting between  and .
- : Gradually raises the volume of the sound assigned to the other side as the crossfader is moved from one side ([A] or [B]) to the other, and decreases the volume of the sound on the side it's moving away from (e.g. moving the crossfader away from the [A] side gradually increases the volume of the [B] side while gradually decreasing the volume of the [A] side).

Outputting sound

Adjusting the channel input volume

- 1 Turn the input selector switch to select an input sound source.**
- 2 Turn the [TRIM] knob to adjust the volume for the input sound.**

The channel level indicator lights up when sound is input to the channel.

Adjusting the channel output volume

- 1 Move the channel fader to adjust the volume for the output sound.**
- 2 Set the [CROSSFADER ASSIGN (A, THRU, B)] selector switch to assign the output sound to the crossfader.**
 - If selecting [THRU], this completes the volume adjustment for the channel output sound.
- 3 Move the crossfader to adjust the volume balance of the two channels.**

Adjusting the master sound volume

- 1 Turn the [LEVEL] knob to adjust the volume for the master sound.

The master level indicator lights up when the master sound is output.

Adjusting the sound

- 1 Sets the [EQ CURVE] switch to the function to be adjusted.
- 2 Turn the [EQ/ISO (HI, MID, LOW)] knobs to adjust the volume of each band.

Setting the fader curve

Set the channel fader curve and crossfader curve.

- 1 Sets the [CH FADER] switch to a channel fader curve.
- 2 Sets the [CROSSFADER] switch to a crossfader curve.

Adjusting the left/right sound balance

You can adjust the left/right balance for sounds output from the following terminals.

- [MASTER 1]
- [MASTER 2]
- [BOOTH]
- [REC OUT]
- [DIGITAL MASTER OUT]
- [USB]
- [PHONES A]
- [PHONES B]

- You can adjust the left/right balance for sound output from the USB port only when [MIX(REC OUT with MIC)] or [MIX(REC OUT without MIC)] is selected for [Mixer Audio Output] in Settings Utility (page 16).

1 Press and hold the [QUANTIZE/UTILITY (WAKE UP)] button.

The Utility menu appears.

2 Turn the [TIME] knob in the Beat FX section or press the [BEAT ◀] or [BEAT ▶] button to select [MIXER SETTINGS], and press the [TAP] button.

The setting items under [MIXER SETTINGS] appear.

3 Turn the [TIME] knob or press the [BEAT ◀] or [BEAT ▶] button to select [BALANCE], and press the [TAP] button.

The [BALANCE] screen appears.

4 Turn the [TIME] knob or press the [BEAT ◀] or [BEAT ▶] button to adjust the left/right balance.

- Only the left channel sound of stereo audio is output when set to the [L] (leftmost) position, and only the right channel sound is output when set to the [R] (rightmost) position.

5 Press the [TAP] button.

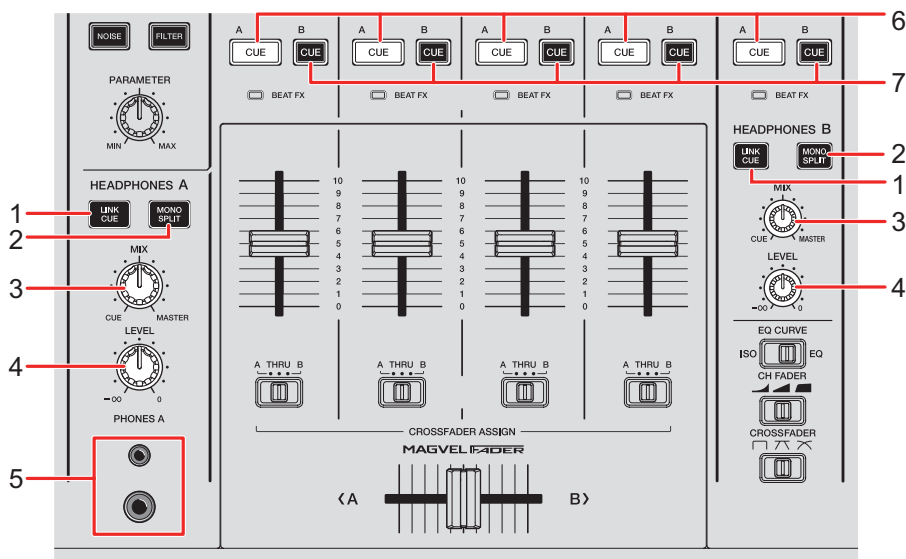
- To cancel the setting, press the [AUTO/TAP] button.

6 Press the [QUANTIZE/UTILITY (WAKE UP)] button.

The [UTILITY] screen closes.

Monitoring sound

Headphones (A/B) section



1. LINK CUE button

Outputs the LINK MONITOR sound.

2. MONO SPLIT button

Sets the sound output method (MONO SPLIT or stereo) for the headphones.

Outputs the sound of the channel with the [CUE A]/[CUE B] button pressed to the left channel of your headphones, and the master sound to the right channel when the button is lit.

Outputs the stereo sound of the channel with the [CUE A]/[CUE B] button pressed when the button isn't lit.

3. MIX knob

Adjusts the volume balance between the channel with the [CUE] button pressed and the master sound.

4. LEVEL knob

Adjusts the volume for the headphones monitor sound.

5. PHONES A terminals

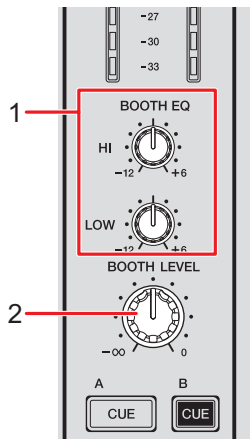
Connect headphones.

- For monitoring sound with [**HEADPHONES B**], connect headphones to the [**PHONES B**] terminals on the front panel (page 22).
6. **CUE A button**
Outputs sound to the [**PHONES A**] terminals.
 7. **CUE B button**
Outputs sound to the [**PHONES B**] terminals.

Monitoring with headphones

- 1 **Connect headphones to the [**PHONES A**] or [**PHONES B**] terminal.**
 - 2 **Press the [**CUE**] button ([**CUE A**], [**CUE B**] or [**LINK CUE**]) to select the sound you want to monitor.**
 - 3 **Press the [**MONO SPLIT**] button of [**HEADPHONES A**] or [**HEADPHONES B**] to set the sound output method (**MONO SPLIT** or **stereo**).**
 - 4 **Turn the [**MIX**] knob to adjust the volume balance between the channel with the [**CUE**] button pressed and the master sound.**
 - 5 **Turn the [**LEVEL**] knob to adjust the volume for the channel with the [**CUE**] button pressed.**
- Press the [**CUE**] button again to turn off monitoring.

Booth section



1. **BOOTH EQ (HI, LOW) knobs**

Adjusts the volume of each band.

Each knob adjusts in the following range.

— **[HI]**: -12 dB to +6 dB

— **[LOW]**: -12 dB to +6 dB

2. **BOOTH LEVEL knob**

Adjusts the volume for the sound output to a booth monitor.

Using a booth monitor

1 **Connect a booth monitor to the [BOOTH] terminals.**

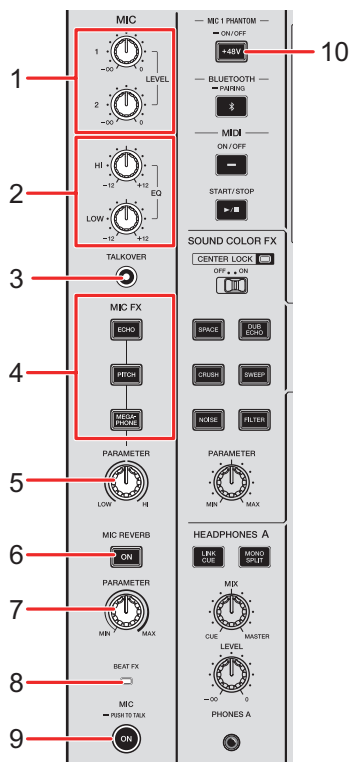

2 **Turn the [BOOTH LEVEL] knob to adjust the volume for the output sound.**

3 **Turn the [BOOTH EQ (HI, LOW)] knobs to adjust the sound.**

Microphone

MIC section



1. LEVEL (1, 2) knobs

Adjusts the volume of sound input from the [MIC 1] and [MIC 2] terminals.

2. EQ (HI, LOW) knobs

Adjusts the volume of sound input from the [MIC 1] and [MIC 2] terminals.

Each knob adjusts in the following range.

- [HI]: -12 dB to +12 dB
- [LOW]: -12 dB to +12 dB

3. TALKOVER button

Turns microphone talkover on and off. The button lights up when it's turned on.

- When sound is input to the microphone, the volume other than the microphone channel is attenuated.

- You can change the talkover mode setting and attenuation level in **[TALKOVER]** in **[MY SETTINGS]** (page 80).

4. **MIC FX buttons**

Select an effect to apply to the microphone sound. The selected button lights up.

- **[ECHO]**: Outputs a delay sound several times while attenuating it to add an echo effect.
- **[PITCH]**: Changes the pitch of the microphone sound.
- **[MEGAPHONE]**: Changes the microphone sound so it sounds like you're talking through a megaphone.

5. **MIC FX PARAMETER knob**

Adjusts the quantitative parameters for the effect selected with the **[MIC FX]** button.

6. **MIC REVERB button**

Turns the microphone reverb on and off. The button lights up when it's turned on.

7. **MIC REVERB PARAMETER knob**

Adjusts the quantitative parameters for the reverb applied to the microphone sound.

8. **BEAT FX indicator**

Lights up when the **[CH SELECT]** button in the Beat FX section is set to **[MIC]**, and blinks when Beat FX is applied to the microphone sound.

9. **MIC button**

Turn the microphone on and off. The button lights up when it's turned on.

- If you press and hold the button, the microphone turns on while the button is pressed and turns off when the button is released (Push-to-talk function).

10. **MIC 1 PHANTOM ON/OFF button**

Press and hold to turn phantom power on and off. The button lights up when it's turned on and DC+48 V phantom power is supplied to the XLR plug of the **[MIC 1]** terminal.

- Turn phantom power on when you use a condenser microphone.
- If the button doesn't light up when it's turned on, the phantom power function is locked. You can unlock it with **[MIC PHANTOM LOCK]** in the Utility settings (page 78).

CAUTION


Do not turn phantom power on except when you have a condenser microphone that requires phantom power connected to the **[MIC 1]** terminal.

Turn phantom power off before connecting or disconnecting a microphone to/from the **[MIC 1]** terminal. If used improperly, the unit may be damaged.

Only turn phantom power on or off when the **[MIC]** button is turned off or when the **MIC [LEVEL 1]** knob is set to the minimum. If phantom power is used improperly, the monitor device may generate a large amount of noise, which may cause device failure or even hearing loss.

Using a microphone

1 Connect a microphone to the **[MIC 1]** or **[MIC 2]** terminal.

2 Press the **[TALKOVER]** button to turn the microphone talkover on or off.

3 Press the **[MIC]** button to turn the microphone on or off.


4 Turn the **[LEVEL 1]** or **[LEVEL 2]** knob to adjust the microphone volume level.

- Note that turning the knob too far clockwise outputs the sound at a high volume.

5 Turn the **[EQ (HI, LOW)]** knobs to adjust the volume of each band.

6 Speak into the microphone.

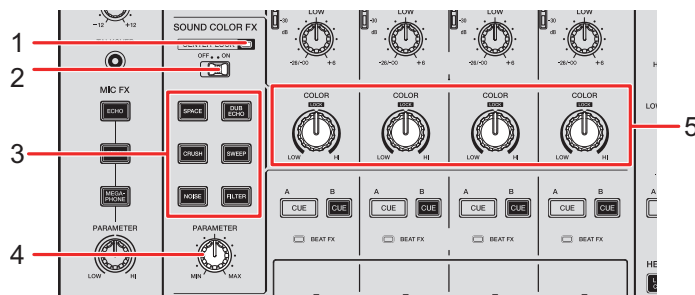
7 To add an effect to the microphone sound, press one of the **[MIC FX]** buttons.

Sound Color FX

You can apply a filter or an effect to the sound on any channel.

1. **CENTER LOCK indicator**

Lights up when the [**CENTER LOCK**] switch is set to [**ON**].

2. **CENTER LOCK switch**

Locks the [**COLOR**] knob when it's quickly turned up to the center position when this switch is set to [**ON**]. The lock is released when you release the knob, then you can turn the knob freely.

3. **SOUND COLOR FX buttons**

Selects a Sound Color FX. The selected button blinks.

Adjusts a quantitative parameter for the effect.

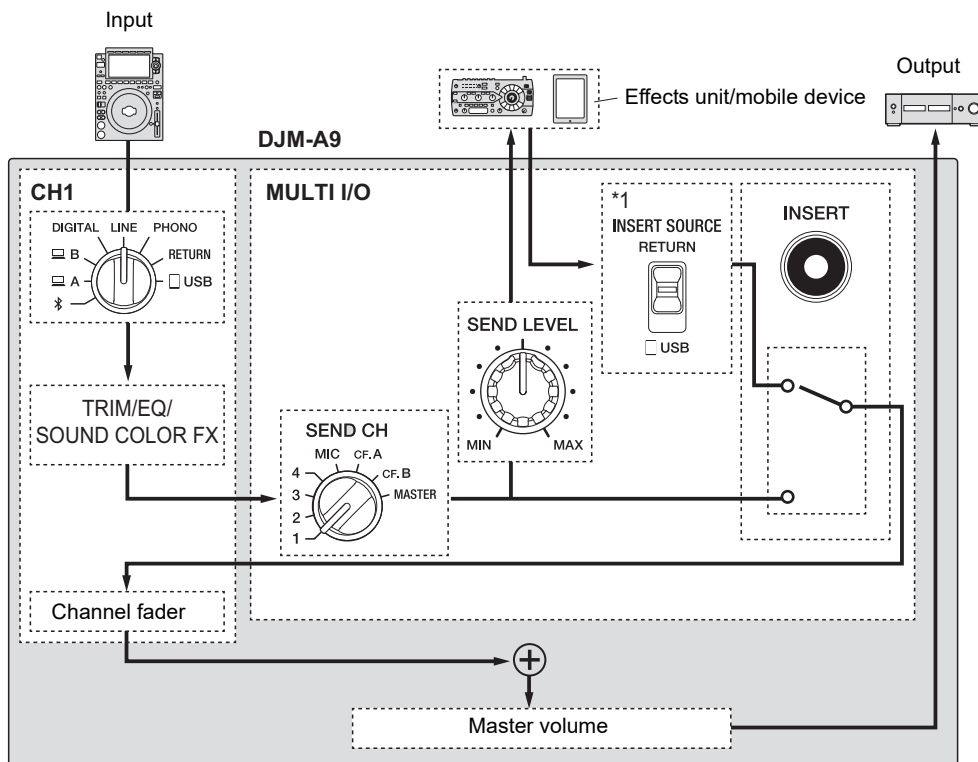

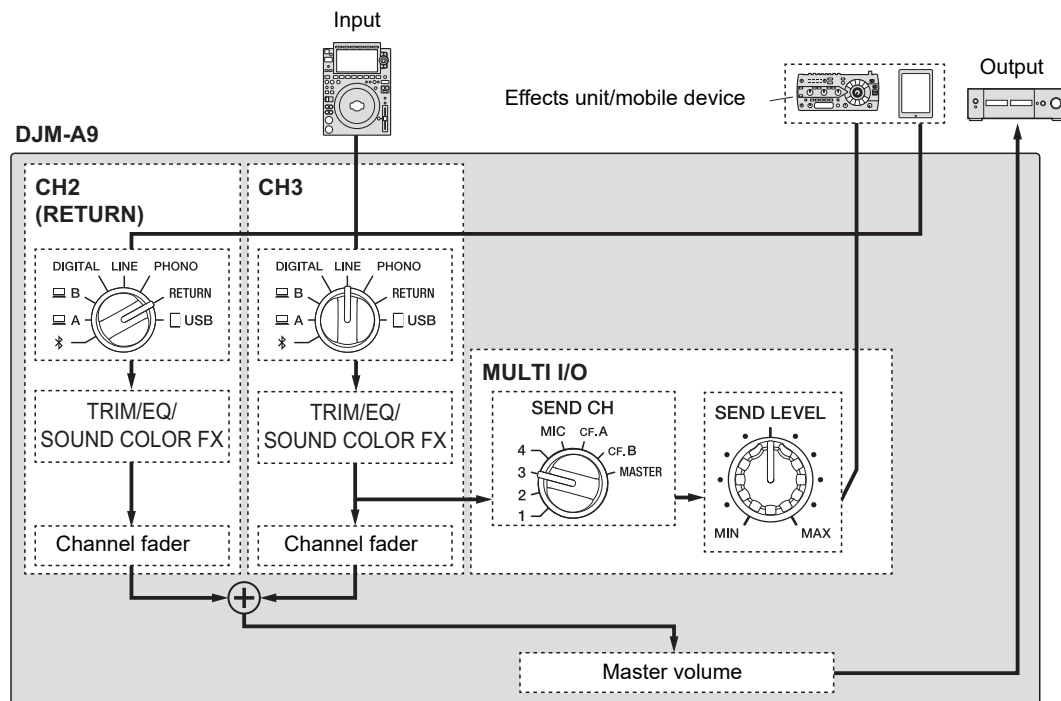

- **Insert method:** Replaces the original sound with the effect sound.



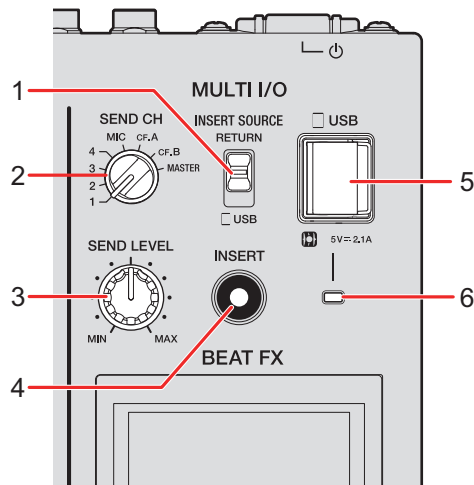
*1 Selects the sound to mix with the master sound. The sound returned from an external effects unit is output when **[RETURN]** is selected, and the sound returned from a mobile device is output when **USB** is selected.

- **Return method:** Routes the effect sound to a channel separate from the one with the original sound. You can then mix the original sound and the effect sound using the two channels.

MULTI I/O section



1. INSERT SOURCE selector switch

Selects a source of input sound for when using the Insert method.

- **[RETURN]**: Inputs sound from the **[RETURN]** terminals.

2. SEND CH selector switch

Selects a channel to add the MULTI I/O effect to.

3. SEND LEVEL knob

Adjusts the send level for MULTI I/O.

4. INSERT button

Turns the Insert method on and off. The button blinks when it's turned on.

5. Mobile device connection terminal (USB port)

Connect a mobile device.

6. USB connection indicator

Lights up when a compatible mobile device is connected, and blinks when an incompatible mobile device is connected.

Using Multi I/O

1 According to the method you use, set the **[INSERT SOURCE]** selector switch or the input selector switch for each channel.

- When you use the Insert method:
 - If using an external effects unit: Set the **[INSERT SOURCE]** selector switch to **[RETURN]**.

2 Turn the **[SEND CH]** selector switch to select a channel to add the **MULTI I/O** effect to.

3 When using the Insert method, press the **[INSERT]** button to turn it on.

- Press the **[INSERT]** button again to turn the Insert method off.
- **MULTI I/O** turns off automatically in the following situations:
 - A channel from **[1]** to **[4]** is selected with the **[SEND CH]** selector switch, and **[RETURN]** is selected with the input selector switch for the selected channel.
 - **[CF.A]** (crossfader A) or **[CF.B]** (crossfader B) is selected with the **[SEND CH]** selector switch, **[RETURN]** is selected with the input selector switch for the selected channel, and the settings selected with the **[CROSSFADER ASSIGN (A, THRU, B)]** selector switch and the **[SEND CH]** selector switch are same.
 - **[MASTER]** is selected with the **[SEND CH]** selector switch, and **[RETURN]** is selected with the input selector switch for any channel.

Beat FX

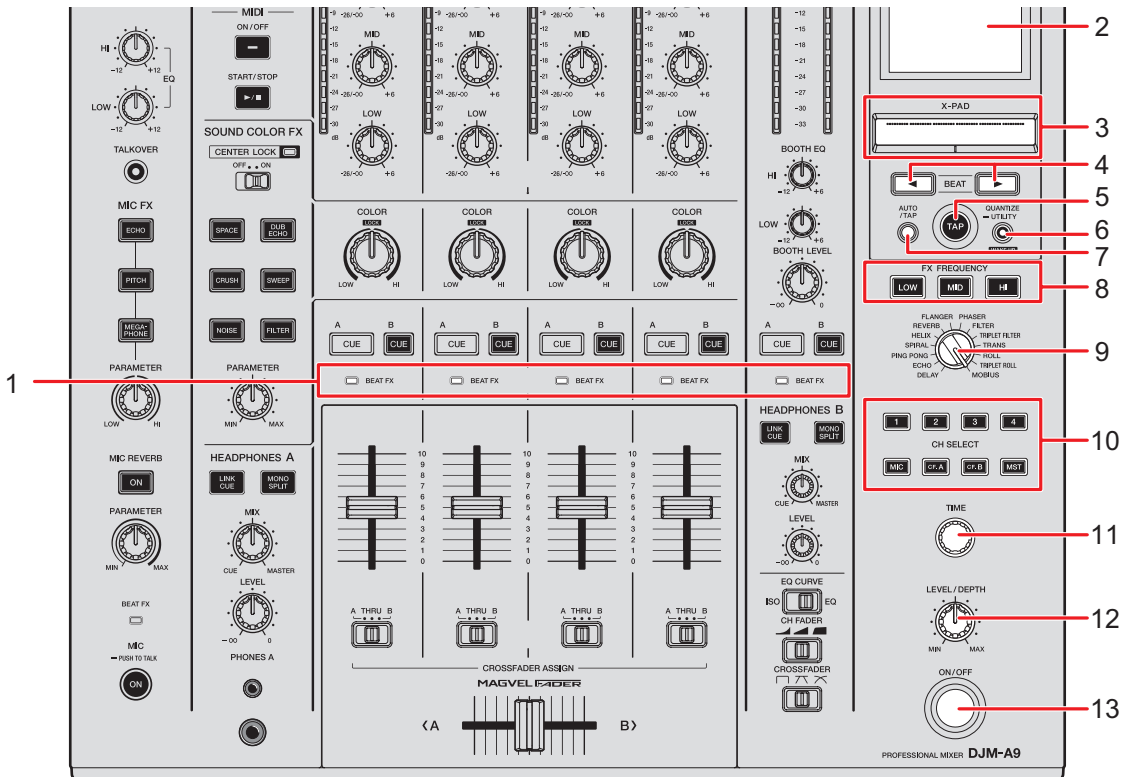
You can add various effects according to the tempo (BPM = Beats Per Minute) of the track being played.

If you use the Quantize function in PRO DJ LINK, the unit adds effects by automatically synchronizing it with the beat according to the track's grid information analyzed by rekordbox. This happens even if you operate the **[ON/OFF]** button in the Beat FX section and X-PAD roughly.

- To use the Quantize function in PRO DJ LINK, connect a PRO DJ LINK compatible multi player from Pioneer DJ to the unit.

Press to turn Quantize on and off. The button lights up when it's turned on.

- AUTO: Automatically measures BPM of the input sound (measuring range: 70 to 180).
- TAP: Manually sets a BPM (page 51).

- AUTO is automatically set when you turn the unit on.

8. **FX FREQUENCY (LOW, MID, HI) buttons**

Selects the range ([LOW]/[MID]/[HI]) to apply Beat FX to. The selected button lights up.

9. **BEAT FX selector switch**

Selects a Beat FX.

10. **CH SELECT button**

Selects a channel to apply a Beat FX to. The selected button lights up.

11. **TIME knob** (page 52)

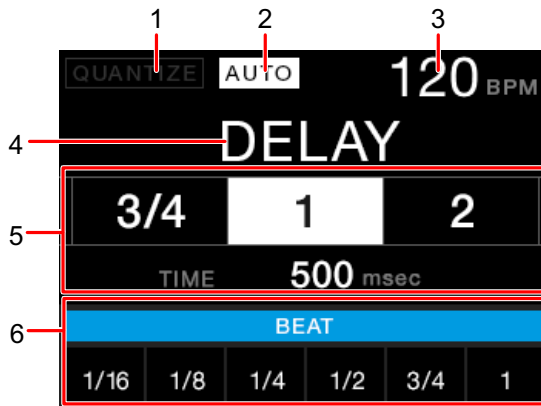
12. **LEVEL/DEPTH knob** (page 52)

- Turning all the way counterclockwise outputs the original sound.

13. **ON/OFF button**

Turns Beat FX on and off. The button blinks when it's turned on.

Screen display



1. QUANTIZE

Indicates the status of the QUANTIZE function as follows.

- Lights up in red: QUANTIZE is turned on.
- Lights up in gray: QUANTIZE is turned on but the unit isn't receiving the GRID information.
- Not displayed: QUANTIZE is turned off.
- The unit may not receive the GRID information depending on the playback status of a connected multi player (e.g. if it's off air, scratching, playing in reverse, etc.).

2. AUTO/TAP

Displays [AUTO] when in automatic BPM measuring mode, and [TAP] when in manual BPM input mode.

- The BPM value blinks when it can't be measured correctly in the [AUTO] setting. Use the [TAP] mode if this happens.

3. BPM value

4. Effect name

Displays the name of the selected effect.

5. Beat/parameter

Lights up the selected number of beat and displays the time corresponding to the number of beat.

- For some effects, you can display parameters by pressing the [BEAT ◀] or [BEAT ▶] button. The display blinks if the number out of the parameter range is set.

6. X-PAD status

Displays the operation position on the X-PAD.

1 Press the [AUTO/TAP] or [QUANTIZE/UTILITY (WAKE UP)] button to set the BPM measuring mode.

2 Turn the Beat FX selector switch to select an effect.

The display for the selected Beat FX appears.

4 Press the [BEAT ◀] or [BEAT ▶] button to set a beat fraction to synchronize the effect with.

5 Press the [FX FREQUENCY (LOW, MID, HI)] button to select the range to apply the effect to.

6 Turn the [TIME] and [LEVEL/DEPTH] knobs to adjust parameters for the effect.

7 Press the [ON/OFF] button (or touch the X-PAD) to turn Beat FX on.

The selected effect is applied to the sound of the channel selected with the [CH SELECT] button.

- Press the [ON/OFF] button again to turn Beat FX off.

Setting the BPM manually

1 Tap the [TAP] button more than twice in time with the beat of the track.

The BPM is set according to the average time between taps.

- The beat fraction is set to [1/1] when you set the BPM with the [TAP] button, and the length of one beat is set as the effect time.
- You can also set the BPM manually by turning the [TIME] knob while pressing the [TAP] button.
- Turn the [TIME] knob while pressing the [TAP] and [AUTO/TAP] buttons, or press the [BEAT ◀] or [BEAT ▶] button while pressing the [TAP] button to set the BPM in increments of 0.1.

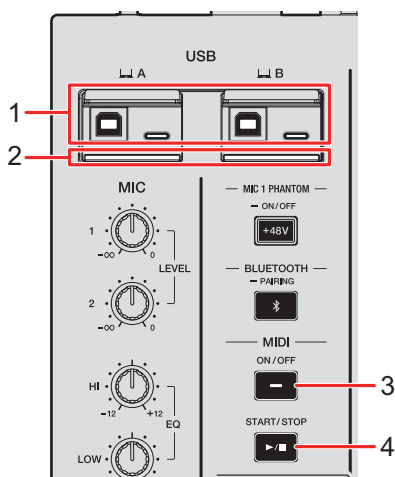

1. A, B (USB) ports (page 22)

- If devices are connected to the Type-B and Type-C ports in [A] or [B] at the same time, they can't be used simultaneously. The port first connected with a device will be active and the other port will be inactive (the USB indicator turns off).

2. USB connection indicator

Blinks when a PC/Mac is connected, and slowly blinks when a PC/Mac without the dedicated software installed is connected.

- To input or output your PC/Mac's audio to/from the unit, install the dedicated software on your computer (page 13).

3. **MIDI ON/OFF button**

Turns MIDI on and off. The button lights up when it's turned on.



4. **MIDI START/STOP button**

Sends the MIDI start/stop messages. The button lights up after the start message is sent, and turns off after the stop message is sent.

Controlling MIDI software

The sending of MIDI messages starts.

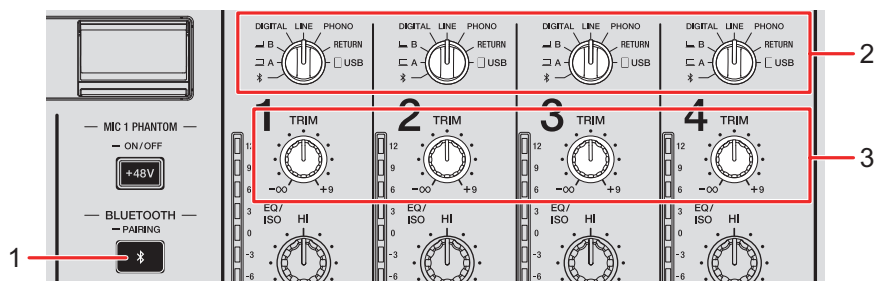
- Press the [MIDI ON/OFF] button again to turn MIDI off and stop sending MIDI messages.
- The MIDI timing clock (BPM) is sent even when the [MIDI ON/OFF] button is switched off.
- Press the [MIDI START/STOP] button to send the MIDI start and stop messages alternately. The messages are sent even when the [MIDI ON/OFF] button is switched off.

Bluetooth

You can input the sound of your PC/Mac or mobile device to the unit via Bluetooth.

Bluetooth section



1. **BLUETOOTH PAIRING button**

Pairs the unit with a Bluetooth device.

The button indicates the connection status as follows.

Pairing with a Bluetooth device

1 Press and hold the [BLUETOOTH PAIRING] button for approximately 2 seconds.

The unit enters pairing state.

- The Bluetooth indicator blinks while the unit is in pairing state (for approximately 2 minutes).

2 Perform the pairing procedure on a Bluetooth device.

The Bluetooth indicator on the unit stops blinking and lights up when the connection is established.

- Perform the pairing procedure on a Bluetooth device while the unit is in pairing state. If the unit can't pair with a Bluetooth device within 2 minutes, the Bluetooth indicator turns off.
- For details on the pairing procedure for the Bluetooth device, refer to the device's instruction manual.
- If you use a Bluetooth device registered to the unit, you can connect the unit with the device by pressing the [BLUETOOTH PAIRING] button briefly.
- You can only connect the unit to 1 Bluetooth device at a time. If the unit pairs with a second device, the registration of the first device will be lost. To register the first device again, perform pairing with the device.

Using a Bluetooth device

- 1 Connect a Bluetooth device with the unit.
- 2 Set the input selector switch for the channel to which Bluetooth audio is input to [*].
- 3 Play sound on the Bluetooth device.
- 4 Turn the [TRIM] knob for the channel to which Bluetooth audio is input to adjust the volume.

Wireless LAN (Wi-Fi)

By connecting a tablet with the unit via Wi-Fi, you can use the Stagehand app on the tablet to check the status of Pioneer DJ multi players or mixers and remote-control them.

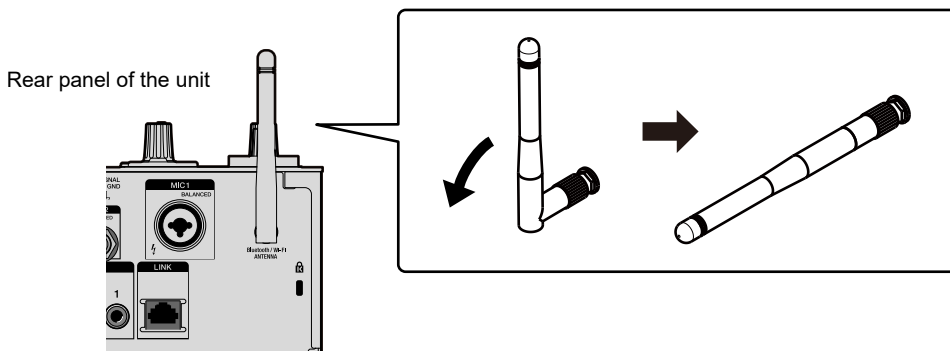
Connecting and disconnecting the wireless antenna

You can connect and disconnect the wireless antenna to/from the unit.

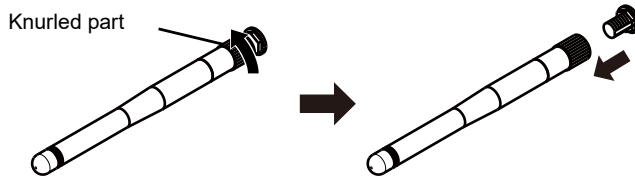
- The wireless antenna is connected by default.
- Do not connect any antenna other than the one supplied with this unit.
- To prevent damage, disconnect the wireless antenna when you pack away or transport the unit.
- Do not apply excessive force to the wireless antenna, or it may be damaged.
- The wireless antenna bends in one direction. Be sure to check the moving part and bend it in the correct direction.

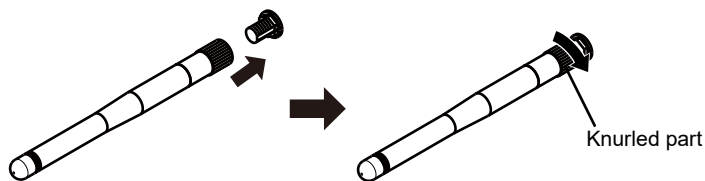

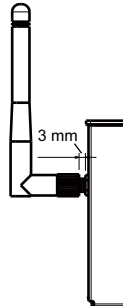

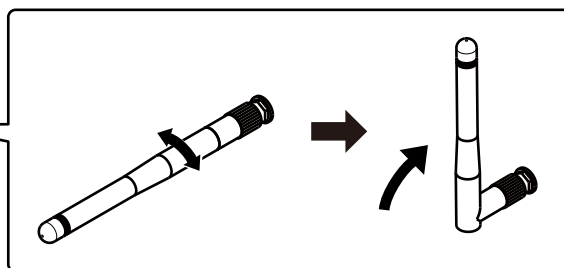
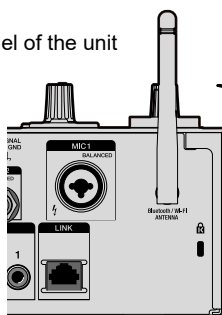

You can call up MY SETTINGS on a storage device plugged into a multi player that is connected to the unit via PRO DJ LINK, or you can call them up from rekordbox.

1 Connect a storage device.

2 Press and hold the [QUANTITY/UTILITY (WAKE UP)] button.

The Utility menu appears.

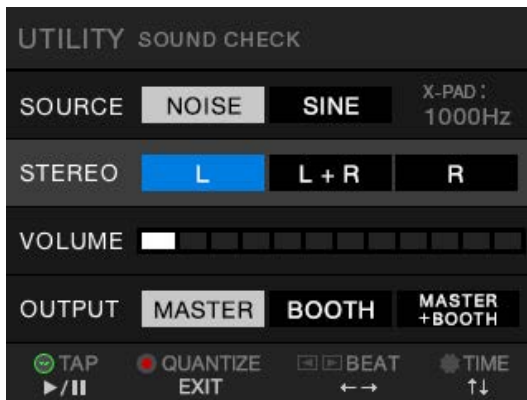

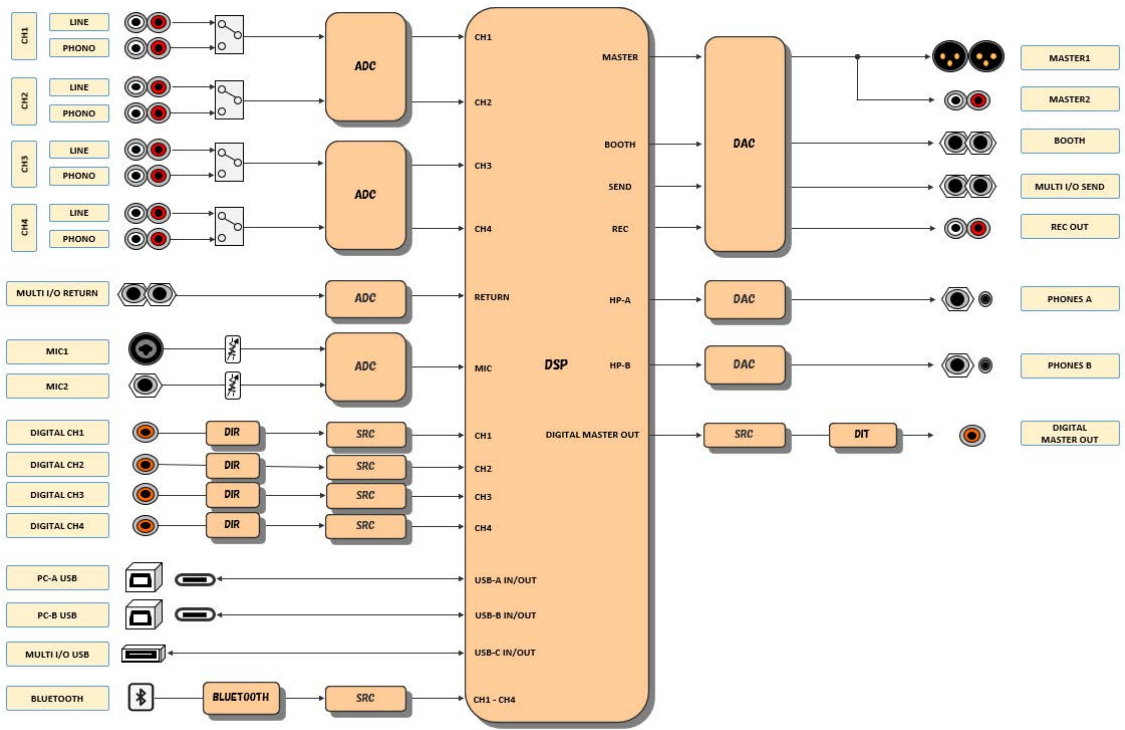

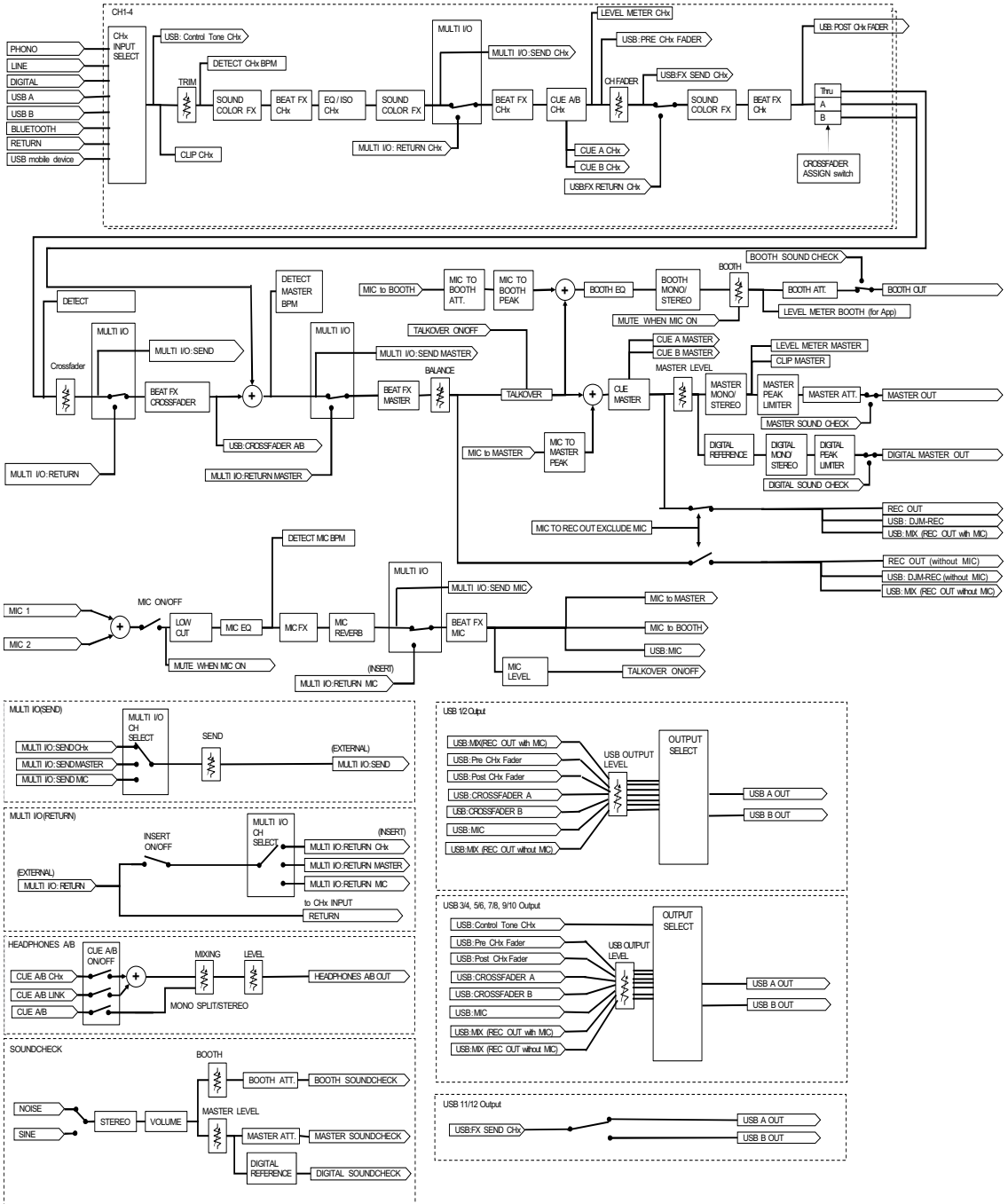

Troubleshooting

- Inspect devices connected with the unit.
- The unit may restore proper operation after you turn it off and on.

If the problems continue, read the “Precautions for Use” and consult an authorized service company or your dealer.

Power

❖ The unit doesn't turn on.

- Check if the power cord is connected properly.
- Press the ⏻ button on the rear of the unit to turn it on.

Audio output

❖ The unit doesn't output sound. The volume is low.

- Check if the input selector switch is set properly.
- Check all cables are connected properly.
- Wipe any dust or dirt off the terminals and plugs before connecting them.
- Change the [ATT.] setting for [MASTER OUT] in the Utility settings.

❖ The unit doesn't output the digital sound.

- Make sure the specified [SAMPLING RATE] setting for [DIGITAL MASTER OUT] in the Utility settings is supported by the connected devices.

❖ Sound is distorted.

For the master sound:

- Adjust the [LEVEL] knob in the MASTER section so the master level indicator lights up with the peak level at around [0] dB.
- Set [ATT.] for [MASTER OUT] to a setting between [-3dB] and [-12dB] in the Utility settings.

For the channel input sound:

- Adjust the [TRIM] knob so the channel level indicator lights up with the peak level at around [0] dB.

❖ The crossfader doesn't work.

- Check if the [CROSSFADER ASSIGN (A, THRU, B)] selector switch is set properly.

Effects

❖ BEAT FX doesn't work.

- Make sure the [FX FREQUENCY (HI, MID, LOW)] button is lit for the band you want to add the effect to.

❖ Sound Color FX doesn't work.

- Check if the [COLOR] knob is set properly.
- Check if the [PARAMETER] knob is set properly.

❖ Mic FX doesn't work.

- Check if the [MIC FX PARAMETER] knob is set properly.

❖ An external effects unit or a mobile device connected to MULTI I/O doesn't work.

- Select a channel to add the effect to with the [CH SELECT] button.
- Make sure any external effects unit is connected to the [SEND] and [RETURN] terminals properly.
- Make sure the mobile device is properly connected to the mobile device connection terminal (USB port). Launch the FX application on the mobile device.
- Make sure the [INSERT SOURCE] selector switch is set properly.
- Check if the [INSERT] button is turned on.

❖ **Sound from an external effects unit is distorted.**

- Make sure the volume for the external effects unit is set properly.

❖ **The tempo (BPM) of a track can't be measured.**

The measured tempo is wrong.

- Adjust the [TRIM] knob so the channel level indicator lights up with the peak level at around [0] dB.
- Tempo (BPM) can't be measured for some tracks. Use the [TAP] button to manually set the tempo for those tracks.

❖ **The measured tempo (BPM) differs from the value shown on the information of the track.**

- The values don't match when BPM measuring methods are different.

MIDI

❖ **You can't control a MIDI device with the unit.**

- Press the [MIDI ON/OFF] button to turn MIDI on.
- Assign this unit's MIDI messages to the software. For details on assignment, refer to the instruction manual for the software.

Connections

❖ **The unit isn't recognized by the connected PC/Mac.**

The USB connection indicator is blinking slowly.

- Install the dedicated software on the PC/Mac. If the software is already installed, reinstall it.

❖ **Sound from the connected PC/Mac isn't outputting from the unit.**

- Make sure the PC/Mac is connected properly.
- It's recommended to connect this unit and a PC/Mac directly with a USB cable.
- When using a USB hub, use a product recommended by the manufacturer of your PC/Mac.
- We don't guarantee the operation of all USB hubs.

- Select this unit in the audio output device settings in the software. For details, refer to the instruction manual for the software.
- Set the input selector switch to [A] or [B].

❖ **Sound is distorted when a turntable is connected to the [PHONO] terminals on the unit.**

The status of the channel level indicator doesn't change when you turn the [TRIM] knob.

- Check if the connected turntable has a built-in phono equalizer (if it does, connect the turntable to the [LINE] terminals).
- If the turntable has a PHONO/LINE selector switch, set it to PHONO.
- If the audio interface for PC/Mac, which is connected between the unit and the turntable, is a line-level device, connect the turntable to the [LINE] terminals.

Bluetooth

❖ **The unit can't connect with a Bluetooth device.**

- Turn on the unit and the Bluetooth device again, and perform the pairing procedure.

❖ **Sound is interrupted.**

- If the unit and the Bluetooth device is placed far apart, bring them closer together.
- If there is an obstacle between this unit and the Bluetooth device, remove it.

Wireless LAN (Wi-Fi)

LCD display
